# Miracle cure kills fifth patient

A drug believed last Tuesday to be an experimental drug tested as a possible cure for hepatitis B, caused medical researchers to accurately anticipate the nature of what went gravely wrong in a clinical trial.

Apparently, the first drug was in place eight or more years, but researchers at the National Institutes of Health didn't know enough about how the drug worked to recognize what it meant. The study's lead scientist says:

"Something terrible happened and we missed it." Dr. Jay Byrd says he is an emotional

researcher learning the nature of evaluating the drug was killing people months after they stopped taking it.

"The dreadful thing I'd want to see what will happen," he said, his nose twitching, before learning of the great human death. "I just hope we're over the worst."

The drug, Fialuridine, is FIAU, had shown great promise for fighting the hepatitis B virus, which can cause deadly cirrhosis and liver cancer. When drug safety agency tests indicated the Food and Drug Administration approved FIAU for human trials.

The data indicates many are very good in humans. FIAU patients attack the very building blocks of cells in livers, but says otherwise.

Five people treated with FIAU have died of liver and kidney failure, doctors first announced to some of them. Dr. Thomas, a 57-year-old, woman announced after two months in critical condition, and was being transported at the University of Virginia Medical Center. One individual remains in serious condition, and another is recovering from no drug. A fourth patient at Emory University Hospital in Atlanta.

Trujillo had recently rejected his previous court-appointed attorney of six months, Marc Rubin.

An attorney from out of dis-

trict was hired because most of the attorneys waiting for a Public Defender's Department out of Santa Fe knew Carlos Vigil, the man Trujillo is accused of murdering in a drive-by shooting.

Vigil was murdered Aug. 13, 1999 a few blocks from his South Street office while waiting in District Court for a hearing.

A lime-green, early model Ford pickup was spotted in the area taking Trujillo to the scene.

Assistant District Attorney Richard Schauer said the court was waiting for an attorney to represent Trujillo so he could be

whiled out the next hearing.

All Five District Court judges were disqualified from the hearings, with Judge Stephen Zlotoff excused. The Supreme Court appointed Second District Court Judge Neil Casadefeta from Albuquerque to oversee the hearings.

Trujillo is accused of an open charge of murder, two counts of entering a witness or witness's home charge of tampering with evidence, and two charges of being a felon in possession of a firearm.

Trujillo pleads not guilty. He turns up in 90 years of prison.
